Membership of the Friends now runs from February to the end of the following January so that we can send out renewal notices after the Christmas postal rush is over. There is a half-year price for memberships commencing after the June talk. Late in the year you will be be expected to pay full price but that will enrol you for the following year. Current members should pay full price and your membership will continue uninterrupted. If you are in any doubt which enrolment fee applies, what period that fee enrols you for or have any other questions please contact the Membership Secretary.

During the year we send out occasional Newsletters and members updates. The default option is to send these by email if we have an email address for you this saves the Friends hundreds of pounds a year which we can then donate to the museum. But if you do NOT want to receive Newsletters by email please let us know.

A section has been added to the form for anyone wishing to include a donation to the Friends in addition to the enrolment fee. *This is optional* and has been introduced to clarify matters as some do so already. All donations will help the Friends support the Museum and play a part in what we hope will be a memorable decade leading up to 2025.

If you downloaded this document it will appear oddly laid out on screen. It is intended to be printed double-sided then folded in half to form an A5 leaflet with this as the back page, the introduction to the right on the front and the talks programme and enrolment form (page two as it appears on the screen) inside.

If you print it you can cut it in half, use the form and keep the programme. Note that for the form and programme you need only print the second page and you certainly do not need to print it in colour.

## Talks Programme and Membership Form for 2020

Darlington Railway Museum, now marketed as "Head of Steam", is housed in the North Road station building opened in 1842 by the world-famous Stockton and Darlington Railway. The Museum is owned and run by Darlington Borough Council and presents the story of Darlington and its central role in railway history. George Stephenson's Locomotion No1 takes pride of place at the head of a line of Darlington built locomotives surrounded by other exhibits. Much of the permanent exhibition will entertain anyone with a general interest in Darlington and there is a varied programme of exhibitions on non-railway subjects. The facilities also include the Northern Rail Activity Room, a children's play room, a conference facility, the Ken Hoole Study Centre with its extensive archive and a café.

The Friends is a non-profit organisation existing to help promote and support Darlington Railway Centre and Museum as well as presenting regular talks for members. The programme for 2020 is listed overleaf along with an enrolment form. All comers are welcome to the talks although we do request a £2 donation from non-members. Whether your interest is in the history or future of railways, their engineering or operation, the Friends' programme has something for you. Benefits also include a newsletter and **free entry to the Museum**.

Visitor numbers at the museum are now at their highest for many years and progress continues to be made in improving the care of the collections. The Friends have given significant financial support for these activities and by joining us you can ensure that we can continue to do this.

In January 2020 Darlington Borough Council approved an ambitious £20m Development Master Plan, funded by the Tees Valley Combined Authority, to refurbish and develop the museum and its surroundings. Under the working title of Darlington Rail Heritage Quarter the intention is to develop the Quarter into an international visitor attraction and museum before 2025 to enable Darlington to be a central part of the Bicentenary celebrations of the Stockton and Darlington Railway. Current ideas (subject to modification as the plan develops) are for the Goods Shed to become the main museum reception and orientation space; the refurbished main station to focus on the story of the Stockton and Darlington Railway from 1825; a public park in the museum grounds; live railway engineering on site; a new car park with disabled-friendly access to the museum, and direct access from North Road station. These are exciting times for the museum - join us now and be part of the journey!
